AHEC Program Office will reach out to Faculty Mentors to confirm that Scholars have participated in the September monthly seminar and will be continuing in the program. Centers are asked to wait to issue checks until after confirmation information is received from mentors. Two \$500 checks per year is the preferred payment method, if possible.</p> <p>In some cases, Centers may have already paid the returning Scholars in August, depending upon budgets, but if Centers have not yet, they are asked to wait until confirmation is received following the September monthly seminar.</p> <p>AHEC Scholars Theme for the first year Scholars is “Health Inequities.” The presentation schedule for the monthly seminars went out last week. Extra seminar presentations will be recorded this year so that they are available to use next year. The schedule is full for this year, which is great! Partners in Prescott, AZ provided a virtual windshield tour and other information about the community. Also completed a True Colors workshop and were able to bond and get to know each other as they build their team. Prescott Park Rangers talked about the Granite Mountain Firefighters. Scholars are looking forward to possibility of an in-person immersion in the spring. NAHEC had great attendance with both new cohorts and faculty mentors working together. First day focused on Flagstaff community assessment, and it also included a presentation on Ryan White program on the reservation and Navajo cultural competency in healthcare. Christy Pacheco spoke about how to do a community assessment. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Jonathan Cartsonis suggested that it would be useful to prepare a cultural competency introduction that students could review before going on a rotation.• SAAHEC shared El Rio's services and population to give the students a feel for urban underserved healthcare. Presentation on needs assessment for Pima and Santa Cruz counties, then from Chiricahua. Also had presentations about the border and refugees. 2nd year Scholars presented on their work at Winchester Heights and shared their experiences with the 1st year Scholars. Presentations also included street medicine and the pandemic and vaccines. Scholars showed impressive Zoom tolerance and were very engaged in conversations. Having both 1st and 2nd year Scholars working together which went very well and gave first-hand info to new Scholars.• WAAHEC had a great experience doing the dual-immersion. The Faculty Mentors worked well together and having both Scholar cohorts together allowed the returning Scholars to have a panel discussion with tips for new Scholars.• EAHEC was also impressed with this group of Scholars- they collaborated and worked together very well. Community this year is Tohono Basin about 30 miles from Payson. Student reflections were insightful. Presentations also included disaster relief programs in Arizona, students from the Tohono Basin entering high school in Payson, from a Nurse Practitioner from the Tohono Basin, and use of drones to deliver medication during recent flooding.• Elias Villarreal suggested best practices model is developing related to dual cohort immersion. Perhaps those that did put the cohorts together could document their best practices and then share out. <p>Discussion of immersion timing and Scholars notification of dates: Courtney Madsen noted that some students didn't know about the immersion date until recently and were concerned about potentially missing. Jennifer noted that Scholar applications come in at all times for a variety of reasons so it does vary when the Scholars are notified. Christy described the UA Nursing program student starting as new students and applications couldn't be any earlier. Discussion	<p>AHEC Scholars January Immersion survey results have been received. All RHPP program directors state colleges and universities are allowing for in-person meetings at this time. Preference from scholars is split between in-person and remote. Spring immersion is scheduled for January 29-30, 2022.</p> <p>Full report on result of AHEC Scholars 2021 Orientation and Immersion survey has been shared with Regional Center and RHPP directors. Finding indicate that Scholars would prefer less time on Zoom. Discussion	<p>Spring AHEC Scholars Immersion was discussed.</p> <p>Jennifer and Nicole met with Faculty Mentors to discuss. Concur that immersion would be available both remotely and in-person, or hybrid, would be appropriate. Faculty Mentors were to reach out to Centers to discuss.</p> <p>NAHEC considering whether the 2 NAHEC cohorts will need separate weekends, but Diane Nunez concerned that students wouldn't be able to work around a new schedule that changes the weekend for some. Courtney noted that they may be able to have groups work on projects together while the other half would be doing activities.</p> <p>Jessica Alcaraz is the Administrative Assistant for SAAHEC.</p> <p>Jonathan doesn't have a feel for whether the Phoenix Med Scholars would prefer in-person or remote immersion options.</p> <p>Elizabeth hasn't heard from Scholars but expects that since classes have moved to in-person they would want to be in-person. However, she's watching where the case counts and rural area burdens are going, so flexibility is valuable.</p> <p>Survey of Scholars from October was somewhat evenly split, but this may have changed by now and will likely change by January.</p> <p>Expectation is that both in-person and remote is offered for the January immersion for Year 1 (2021-2023) Scholars. Year 2 (2020-2022) Scholars have voiced desire for an in-person opportunity because they've only been fully remote.</p> <p>WAHEC is leaning towards offering fully remote due to COVID cases.</p> <p>Don't want to put a burden on communities or be unsafe if in-person would cause issues.</p> <p>Shelley is the mentor for NAHEC Year 2 and is still unsure of what the group will do. 	<p>by next week. 2nd year group hasn't had any face-to-face time, so she's willing to try to work through a way to offer in-person if possible.</p> <p>NAHEC did undergraduate hybrid immersion in November. The undergraduate mentors had input on adapting what is usually done (community scavenger hunt for the windshield survey). NAHEC did 2 weekends for undergraduate Scholars and some Scholars did join remotely. In-person groups included remote participants connected via text. In-person sent photos while remote did online research and put together a slideshow, so that remote Scholars were included and felt connected to the process. Another weekend all Scholars were in-person, and found between the two that there were benefits to the team to have a "home base" remote member doing computer work to speed up time to presentation at the end of the activity.</p> <p>CAAHEC is planning in-person for undergrads- do they need to include remote? Discussion	<p>NAHEC ASP Spring Immersion was two full days for YR1 cohort with 23 in-person/remainder virtual and one day for YR2 cohort with 4 in-person. Received positive feedback.</p> <p>SAAHEC ASP Spring Immersion was two full days with 8 in-person/remainder online. On day 2 participants completed a community tour/assessment with a community advocate. Received positive feedback.</p> <p>CAAHEC ASP Spring Immersion was offered as split immersions on different weekends for first and second year cohorts, YR1 cohort had 13 in-person and 3 virtual. Speakers from the Prescott community addressed community interests, and then participants toured the community and worked on the community assessment. Undergraduate immersion was offered as a one-day experience with 16 in-person/2 virtual. Participants toured a men's homeless shelter and had discussions with individuals utilizing the services at the homeless shelter. Afterwards, speakers discussed a variety of topics including border health, homeless, asylum seekers and undocumented immigrants.</p> <p>WAHEC ASP Spring Immersion included speakers who discussed mental healthcare services for children.</p> <p>EAHEC ASP Spring Immersion was offered virtually to the Year One cohort over two days with seven speakers discussing a variety of topics with participants. Participants are working with Dr. Hunt in the Tonto Basin community to finish projects. Received positive feedback.</p> <p>As discussed with Center Directors and RHPP Directors previously, HRSA Competing Continuation Grant for AHEC Program will involve changes and transitions to AHEC Scholars Program with Centers taking lead with Faculty Mentors and planning moving forward.</p> <p>RHPP Directors were reminded that their semi-annual narrative was due on 2/14 and asked to include any available data regarding graduation or employment data in their narrative.</p> <p>RHPP Conference Poster Description submissions will remain open until February 23, 2022. Discussion	<p>Welcome to Bettie Coplan who is the new NAU PA RHPP Director.</p> <p>Five year competing continuation grant was submitted to HRSA.</p> <p>The Tenth Annual RHPP Interprofessional Conference was held on April 8-9, 2022, with 212 participants. Participant list by RHPP has been distributed to RHPP Directors. Survey results from participants will be distributed upon completion.</p> <p>AHEC Scholars Program application being finalized. Testing of enhanced application process is anticipated to begin next week with the RHPPs. RHPP Directors will be sent email notifications that a student has applied, and they will then login to the Sales Force portal to review, approve, or disapprove. Nicole receives notification of approvals and will assign to a Regional Center. Once assigned, Centers will have full access to the participants within Sales Force.</p> <p>HRSA Annual Performance Report is due to HRSA in July. AzAHEC reports about 10% of all rotations nationally and almost 500% of the average AHEC rotations. Due to this, the data base will be closing early. Discussion	<p>Street Medicine Phoenix is an interprofessional program in coordination with UArizona, ASU, NAU, Mayo Clinic, Midwestern University and Creighton University. Dedicated to uniting all students interested in street medicine to share best practices, resources, ideas and research; to ensure access to quality healthcare for populations living on the streets; and being able to spotlight community services to those who need them. Core functions include addressing social determinants of health as a mobile health outreach through health and community resource navigation, and advocacy and homelessness research. Goals are to reduce homeless population's reliance on emergency departments for health care by linking them with a primary medical home, connecting them with existing community agencies to meet their long-term needs, and decrease the prevalence of homelessness in the area. Street runs involve 4 teams with preceptors and can provide most medical services PCPs provide. Currently have served over 2300 individuals to date. Future vision for the program includes fostering a partnership with Circle the City for chronic disease management, expand to other cities (Tucson also has a similar street medicine program), offer lab services and dermatopathology, connect with telemedicine and telehealth, target outreach to super-utilizers of the health care system using hotspotting in hospital EDs by providing them with community resources and offer home visits for individuals placed in housing programs that don't have the ability to seek care.
