
### **Collaboration Between AzAHEC Regional Centers and RHPPs:**

#### **AzAHEC Scholars Program**

The AzAHEC Scholars Program (ASP) is a twoyear interprofessional program providing health profession students with advanced communitybased experiences in rural and underserved settings in the AzAHEC Regional Center services areas. Graduate-level RHPP students are selected for participation by their RHPP, and health profession undergraduate students are selected by American Indian AHEC. A total of 520 scholars are currently enrolled or have completed the ASP.
